HANDPRINT CHICKS

Hand painting is a fun, sensory activity to help your kids explore and self express creatively!


What you need

Old newspaper Craft-safe paint

(If you don't have any paint, make your own using the recipe below)



Any paper
Paint brush
Coloured pens for detail



Method

Find an area, perhaps a large outdoor table and cover it in old newspaper to protect the surface.

Depending on their age, spread paint evenly over your child's hand using a paint brush or let them do it.

Ask your child to press their hand down gently, but firmly onto the paper to create a hand print (if he or she understands) and then gently lift their hand.

Add details to the chick using the coloured pens

DIY PAINT (ONE FOR THE GROWN UPS!)

1 cup of flour
2 1/2 cups of cold water
2 table spoons of salt
Food colouring in different colours

- 1. Mix the water and flour in a saucepan over low heat until combined. Add the salt and stir, then remove from the heat.
- 2. Pour the paint base into a spare container and leave until the paint is cool.
- 3. Add food dye (a little at a time) and stir to combine. The more colour you add the brighter and bolder the colours become
- 4. Start painting!



EASTER BONNET

This simple activity is an easy and affordable way to make a gloriously colourful easter bonnet with your children!



What you need

Straw hat

Coloured tissue paper

Scissors (one for the grown ups!)

Extra decorations such as mini fluffy plush chicks
Glue or something to fasten decorations to the hat

Method

Using coloured tissue paper, cut out 3 flower shapes

Holding the 3 shapes, pinch in the centre and twist slightly to create a flower

Repeat this step as many times as you wish

Stick the flowers and extra decorations to the hat, making a colourful arrangement

Finally, enjoy Easter and celebrate in style wearing your hat!





Learn to make chocolate nests!
No oven needed

INGREDIENTS



200g milk chocolate

85g shredded wheat

Mini chocolate eggs

Cupcake cases



METHOD

Break up the chocolate

Melt the chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl in the microwave for 30 second intervals (Psst You'll need a grown up to help you with the microwave)

Break up the shredded wheat and combine with the melted chocolate

Spoon the mixture into cupcake cases to create the nests

Place as mini eggs on top of each nest

Leave in the fridge until set, then enjoy!

Can you sing a song about your favourite story?


Make a den and read a story in your den
